



WALKING ON AIR: The world's most famous choirboy, Welsh singer Aled Jones, visited Adelaide recently, meeting one of South Australia's most promising young vocalists. Aled – who shot to celebrity in the 1980s as a boy soprano – performed for one night only at Adelaide's Festival Theatre as part of his whistlestop tour of Australia, taking time out to catch up backstage with 15-year-old Siobhan Owen, a chorister and soloist at St Francis Xavier's Cathedral. Aled and Siobhan have a lot in common. Aled comes from the village of Llandegfan, North Wales, while Siobhan is from the neighbouring village of Llanfairpwllgwyngyll (shortened name for Llanfairpwllgwyngyllgogerychwyrndrobwlllantysiliogogoch). The pair have both won many Eisteddfodau (singing competitions) in their respective countries, enjoy performing in musicals and sing much of the same repertoire.
